### INVENTORY OF DATA SETS DEALING WITH YOUNG MALE SEXUALITY, CONTRACEPTION, AND FATHERHOOD

The Family Impact Seminar at the Catholic University of America commissioned a paper from Sociometrics Corporation to assess the state of existing data on *young male* sexuality, contraception, and fatherhood. The paper served as input to a conference on Young Unwed Fatherhood sponsored by the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation. In the hope of encouraging secondary analysis of the best available data on the topic, Sociometrics staff prepared the commissioned paper as well as a 200-page appendix that listed and described the ten located data sets and their contents (2,358 variables duly sorted by data set source, topic, and type). Both the paper and the associated appendix were made available to researchers interested in young male fertility-related behavior.
