

SOCIOMETRICS PROJECT No. 46

DATA ARCHIVE ON ADOLESCENT PREGNANCY AND PREGNANCY PREVENTION

This project was a continuation of Projects 3, 16, and 29, the Data Archive on Adolescent Pregnancy and Pregnancy Prevention (DAAPPP). Under this contract, DAAPPP was broadened to include data sets on adolescent sexual health. Data sets that addressed factors demonstrated to relate to adolescent pregnancy and STD risk were also evaluated for inclusion under this contract.

The following products were made available for each data set in the collection:

- **Three machine-readable files**, one containing the study's *raw data*, another containing *SPSS-X program statements* to transform the raw data file into an SPSS-X system file, and the third containing *SAS program statements* to transform the raw data file into an SAS system file.
- **A User's Guide** that includes: 1) a general study overview; 2) a description of machine-readable files and available supplementary documentation; 3) a key characteristics report; 4) a categorization and listing of variables by topic and type; 5) a data completeness and consistency report; and 6) a references section listing publications using the data set.
- **The original instrument**, when applicable.
- **The original codebook**, when supplied by the principal investigator.

The *Information Resource on Adolescent Health (IRAH)* was added to DAAPPP, providing easy access to the latest scientific findings on adolescent pregnancy and sexual health. Top scientific journals and books were surveyed, and relevant articles were abstracted. The abstracts, along with information about the source (author, title, reference, topic code) have been put on CD-ROM (with a search and retrieval system) and in a book.
