DEVELOPMENT OF EVALUATION INSTRUMENTS FOR THE EXPANDED CLINIC STUDY, SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH, U.C. BERKELEY

This project involved developing a set of six evaluation instruments to be used by the U.C. Berkeley School of Public Health in its evaluation of the Expanded Clinic Study (ECS). The ECS is a state-sponsored program to test the effectiveness of delivering family planning services at expanded clinic sites that are located in social service agencies frequented by low income persons. Sociometrics' role was to draw on the evaluation instrument literature and to develop new instrument items to provide the sponsor with six evaluation instruments tailor-made for the ECS evaluation. The instruments were the following:

- 1) Background/demographic profile: family planning clients
- 2) Pretest knowledge & perceptions of the ECS concept: social service & clinic staff
- 3) Family planning services, health status: ECS clients
- 4) Client satisfaction with ECS services: ECS clients
- 5) Family planning services, health status: regular clinic clients
- 6) Posttest knowledge & perceptions of the ECS concept: social service & clinic staff
