### **ARCHIVE AND TUTORIAL OF EFFECTIVE HIV/AIDS PREVENTION PROGRAMS PHASE I**

This Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Phase I project's objectives were twofold: (1) to develop innovative approaches for training curricula to be used with health departments, community-based organizations, and national and regional minority organizations for HIV/AIDS/ prevention; and (2) to develop computer-based, desktop training for public health applications and/or general software used on local area networks (LAN). Development of such an application or LAN may be accomplished in the form of software and multi-media information communication.

This SBIR Phase I project accomplished the following:

- Task 1. Identified, described, and selected an adult HIV/AIDS prevention program that will be the prototype for Product 1, the Archive of Effective HIV/AIDS Prevention Programs.
- Task 2. Developed and designed the prototype for Product 1, the Archive of Effective HIV/AIDS Prevention Programs.
- Task 3. Developed and designed a prototype for Product 2, the set of printed and computer-based tutorials on how to setup, implement or adapt, operate, monitor, and evaluate: (1) each Product 1 "effective program," and (2) any other HIV/AIDS prevention program.
- Task 4. Obtained input on the design and prototype modules for Products 1 and 2 from a diverse group of expert HIV/AIDS prevention program directors, staff members, and evaluators.
- Task 5. Finalized the products' design and prototype modules based on the input received.
