HIV/AIDS PREVENTION PROGRAM ARCHIVE PHASE II

This Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Phase II project, which was a follow-on to Project No. 60, established an archive of adult HIV/AIDS prevention programs with demonstrated evidence of effectiveness. The archive entitled HIV/AIDS Prevention Program Archive (HAPPA) built on the Program Archive on Sexuality, Health & Adolescence (PASHA), a highly successful collection of effective teen pregnancy and teen STD/HIV/AIDS prevention programs. Each program package in the HAPPA archive includes everything needed to replicate and re-evaluate the promising program:

- (1) A complete set of program materials, such as Instructor's Manual, workbook, video, etc.;
- (2) an accompanying evaluation packet for reassessing the effectiveness of the program in a new site; and
- (3) a User's Guide prepared by archive staff describing the program/evaluation package and providing program implementation guidelines and tips.

A monograph containing case studies in effective HIV/AIDS interventions was also developed. Additionally, archive staff provide purchasers of HAPPA programs with free and ongoing technical assistance on program implementation and evaluation.
